Statement from Acting OMB Director Robert Fairweather

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Revision of Civil Immigration Enforcement Policies and Priorities”**

This executive order revokes Executive Order 13768. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include enforcing civil immigration laws in a way that protects national and border security, addresses the humanitarian challenges at the southern border, and ensures public health and safety. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-year fiscal period beginning in fiscal year 2021. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include the Departments of State, Justice, Homeland Security; the Office of Management and Budget; Office of Personnel Management; and all other relevant departments and agencies.
