Summary of Principals' Meeting July 22, 2022

Overview

On July 22, 2022, the Arctic Executive Steering Committee (AESC) held its third Principals' Meeting in the Biden-Harris Administration. Dr. Alondra Nelson, Deputy Assistant to the President, performing the duties of the Director of the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, chaired the meeting. Katie Tobin represented the President's National Security Advisor, Jake Sullivan, who serves as AESC Vice Chair.

Background

President Obama created the AESC through Executive Order 13698 and directed it to

provide guidance to executive departments and agencies and enhance coordination of Federal Arctic policies across agencies and offices, and, where applicable, with State, local, and Alaska Native tribal governments and similar Alaska Native organizations, academic and research institutions, and the private and nonprofit sectors.
