Statement from OMB Director Shalanda Young

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order on “COVID-19 and Public Health Preparedness and Response”**

This executive order would rescind certain prior executive orders related to COVID-19 that are no longer necessary at this stage of the COVID-19 response and would transfer certain ongoing responsibilities of the COVID-19 Response Team (CRT) to the Office of Pandemic Preparedness and Response Policy (OPPR). Implementing this executive order would have no impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include rescission of COVID-19 related policies that are no longer necessary at this stage of the Federal Government’s response, and to facilitate the Administration’s transition toward a longer-term response to address the circumstances of COVID-19 and pandemic preparedness more broadly. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-year fiscal period beginning in fiscal year 2024. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include all Federal agencies.
