# OMB Report to Congress on United States Contributions to the United Nations and Affiliated International Organizations for Fiscal Year 2023

The following report on U.S. Contributions to the United Nations (UN) is prepared pursuant to section 312 of the Department of State Authorities Act, Fiscal Year 2017 (FY 2017 Authorities Act) (Public Law 114-323, *"see also* 22 U.S.C. § 287b-1) and section 4(b) of the United Nations Participation Act (Dec. 20, 1945, ch. 538, as amended, *see also* 22 U.S.C. § 287b(b)).

Section 312 of the FY 2017 Authorities Act requires the Director of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to submit to the Congress a report on all assessed and voluntary contributions with a value greater than \$100,000, including in-kind, of the U.S. government to the United Nations and its affiliated agencies and related bodies during the previous fiscal year.

Section 4(b) of the United Nations Participation Act further requires the Secretary of State to submit an annual report to the Congress on the extent and disposition of all financial contributions (any amount) made by the United States during the preceding year to international organizations (including the UN and its affiliated agencies) in which the United States participates as a member.

Due to the significant overlap in these two reporting requirements, this report for fiscal year 2023 addresses both by covering contributions of any amount to international organizations and multilateral entities (including the UN and its affiliated agencies) for fiscal year 2023. The report includes funding in support of certain multilateral entities that are not generally considered international organizations.

For each entry, the report provides specific information including: the responsible U.S. government agency and bureau, the account that was the source of the funding, the recipient entity, a description of the purpose of the activity that the funding supported, the amount obligated, and whether the Department considers the amount provided to be an assessed contribution.

Note, the grand total of contributions under section 312 does not match that of contributions tabulated for section 4(b) since the former is limited to contributions to UN and affiliated agencies and the latter covers the entirety of contributions to all international organizations. The report includes funding in support of certain multilateral entities that are not generally considered international organizations. The format of this report is similar to previous OMB reports on contributions.

The Department of State collaborated with OMB on the production of the report and has also submitted it to Congress and will post it on its website at <u>https://www.state.gov/u-s-contributions-to-international-organizations</u>, consistent with the United Nations Participation Act. Some of the information included in the report was provided to OMB by the Executive Branch agencies identified in the report. Each participating agency was responsible for the completeness and accuracy of the information provided. Not all Executive Branch agencies provided information for inclusion in the report.

The amounts of U.S. government funding included in this report are amounts of funding obligated in fiscal year 2023. The amounts of total funding to recipient entities from all sources in the report is generally listed by calendar year, except for funding for UN peacekeeping missions, which have a July 1 through June 30 financial year. The amounts of total funding are obtained from publicly available documents produced by the recipient entities.

The information provided on U.S. government funding includes financial and in-kind support, including assessed contributions, voluntary contributions, grants, and other financial assistance to international organizations and multilateral entities. In some instances, the amounts presented are negative. These negative amounts reflect de-obligations of funds previously obligated, including in prior fiscal years. This report includes all obligations and de-obligations made in fiscal year 2023.

This report does not contain information on contracts for goods or services provided to the U.S. government, the cost to the U.S. government of the salaries and expenses of American employees detailed to the secretariats of

international organizations, or the costs of reimbursing international organizations for taxes that American citizens and legal permanent residents employed by the organizations pay to U.S. federal, state, and local governments. Contributions to international financial institutions such as the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development are not included in this report but are the subject of a separate report to the Congress by the National Advisory Council on International Monetary and Financial Policies.

## UN PEACEKEEPING OPERATIONS

The U.S. government and the UN account for peacekeeping contributions using different accounting periods. U.S. data is collected according to the U.S. fiscal year (October-September), while the UN peacekeeping financial year runs from July 1 through June 30 of the following calendar year. To address this timing difference, the U.S. percentage share is calculated by dividing the amount of U.S. fiscal year obligations by the total amount to be contributed by all UN member states for each assessment paid in the given U.S. fiscal year.
